- Maintain high-quality PE across the school PE Lead to continue monitoring the planning, delivery, and assessment of fundamental skills progression to ensure consistency and high standards across all year groups. Provide targeted support and mentoring to new staff and further develop experienced staff through lesson modelling, shared planning, and feedback.
- Strengthen cross-curricular physical activity Further embed and evaluate the impact of 'Active Maths' and 'Active English' initiatives across the school day.

 Promote active learning strategies in foundation subjects, supported by specialist CPD (e.g. music and movement, drama, dance) to boost engagement and physical activity levels.
- Sustain and deepen staff CPD Build on previous CPD with ongoing practical support from internal expertise and external specialists (e.g. Mr. Cooper). Focus CPD on game application, differentiation, and inclusive practice to develop both confidence and subject knowledge.
- Enhance pupil voice and leadership in PE Develop the role of Sports Ambassadors and use pupil voice meetings to influence PE provision and playground activity planning. Encourage leadership, responsibility, and inclusive participation through peer-led initiatives and regular feedback I
- Enrich curriculum through external providers and inclusive opportunities Continue to engage with organisations such as AmaSing, Accent Dance, and explore other providers to provide creative, inclusive and cross-curricular PE opportunities. Ensure a broad and balanced offer that appeals to all pupils, including those less engaged by traditional sport.
- **Support talent and long-term participation in sport** Identify children with potential in specific skill areas and strengthen pathways to external clubs and community opportunities. Celebrate success and ensure those children are supported through enrichment opportunities and recognition.
- **Promote inclusive, meaningful competition** Expand intra-school competition opportunities across year groups in collaboration with PE specialists, ensuring access for all pupils. Use competition to build resilience, teamwork, and sportsmanship, while maintaining a positive and supportive ethos.
- **Celebrate physical activity and achievement across the school** Use events such as Sports Day, visiting athletes (e.g. Michael Churm), and whole-school initiatives to promote participation and celebrate effort. Continue to provide recognition through inclusive rewards (e.g. medals for all) and pupil-led events.
- Invest in quality resources and equipment Replenish and maintain PE and playground equipment to support effective delivery of fundamental skills and promote active playtimes. Ensure resources are accessible and age-appropriate to support progression across all key stages.
- Maintain external affiliations and professional development Renew AfPE membership to stay updated with national guidance, health and safety standards, and curriculum developments. Continue attending PE networking meetings to share good practice and broaden competitive and enrichment opportunities for pupils.
